July 15th Program – Barb Gardner

The July Guild meeting will provide a different take on quilt design. Barb Gardner will be presenting a lecture and trunk show on Electric Quilt. Even if you do not plan to use your computer to design quilts, the program will be interesting and informative.

Barb will teach two workshops, "Spinwheels," (half day, \$20 plus \$5 pattern) and "Beyond Basic Bindings" (full-day, \$30). See pictures of both projects on page 3. "Spinwheels" is a striking art quilt project, where Barb will teach you to create curves and circles without the usual problem of matching seams. During the class, you will complete a small wall hanging, but that is not the end of it! You will be able to make larger quilts using the same pattern, or even use the same technique on other quilts.

"Beyond Basic Bindings" (full day, \$30) is a skills-based class in which Barb will teach several different bindings and decorative edge finishes. You will be able to pick and choose which finishes you want to learn.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Piecing Partners is an educational non-profit group. As Guild members, we are very lucky to be able to take workshops from nationally-known instructors at fantastic prices. These workshops are meant to help you improve your skills and widen your horizons, and we encourage you to participate. To date, we do not have enough signups to hold the, "Spinwheels" workshop and it is in danger of being canceled. We hope more of you will take advantage of this nationally-known instructor, the great price, and come learn this fun technique! 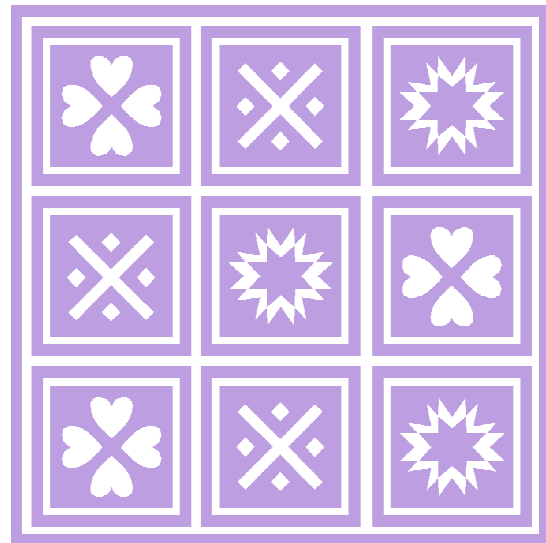

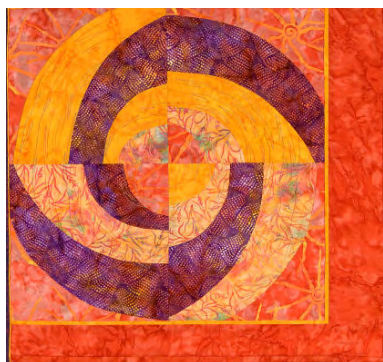

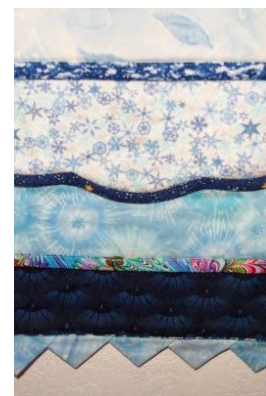

All workshops are held at High Country Quilts. Unless otherwise noted, the half day workshops are from 1:30pm–4:30pm the day of the Guild meeting. Students may come at 1:00 to set up. 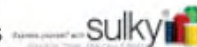

The RMQF will be held August 22-23, The Ranch, I-25 & the Crossroads Blvd., Loveland. (Exit 259 off I-25.)

To date we have just 17 entries and we need approximately 25 to fill the PPQG booths. If you have not signed up, we encourage you to do so. This is a wonderful opportunity to display the works of our very talented Guild members.

To enter a quilt to hang in the Piecing Partners Quilt Guild Booths:

1. You must sign up online. Go to <http://www.rockymountainquiltfoundation.org/>. Click on Quilt Entry Forms and Guidelines. There is a \$5 entry fee. Fill in the form and submit online, and mail entry fee to Rocky Mountain Quilt Festival using the address provided.
2. Entries and entry fees must be received by Rocky Mountain Quilt Festival no later than July 24th.
3. Piecing Partners needs enough quilts to fill our booths and we encourage members to submit their work. Once our booth is full, additional entries are welcome but will be hung in the general show, rather than the PPQG booths.
4. Rocky Mountain Quilt Festival allows 3 entries.
5. Please make sure that Vinda Robison (vindarobison@comcast.net, (719) 594-0694) or Joyce Reed (jquiltinglady@aol.com, (719) 535-9477) know about your entries for the Guild and their sizes so we can fill the space we have. Please let Vinda know about any other items being delivered to Ruth's that are going to the RMQF (email preferred).
6. Items need to be dropped off at Ruth's Stitchery August 4th, 5th, or 6th. Vinda will pick them up at Ruth's Stitchery August 6th at 5:30pm and deliver them to the drop off point. Vinda will also take your extra entries, so you may also drop those off at Ruth's.
7. Vinda will pick up all quilts and return them to Ruth's Stitchery August 24th at 10am. You will need to pick up your quilt on August 24th after 10am.
8. The Rocky Mountain Quilt Festival will do all of the hanging of the quilts.

We need volunteers to work in the PPQG booths at the event. Volunteers will white glove and sell tickets for the Opportunity Quilt. Signup sheets will be available at the July and August meetings.

- ✓ All items **must be labeled** with the owner name, name of the maker, name of the quilter (if different), title and date made.
- ✓ Wearable jackets must have a drape. (To make a drape: choose a color that best shows off your jacket. Divide 1 yard of fabric into thirds and sew ends together to form a drape approx 15" wide by 100" long. This drape will hide the hanging system.)

All quilts will be pinned to the hanging system. Smaller quilts may be pinned to another surface.

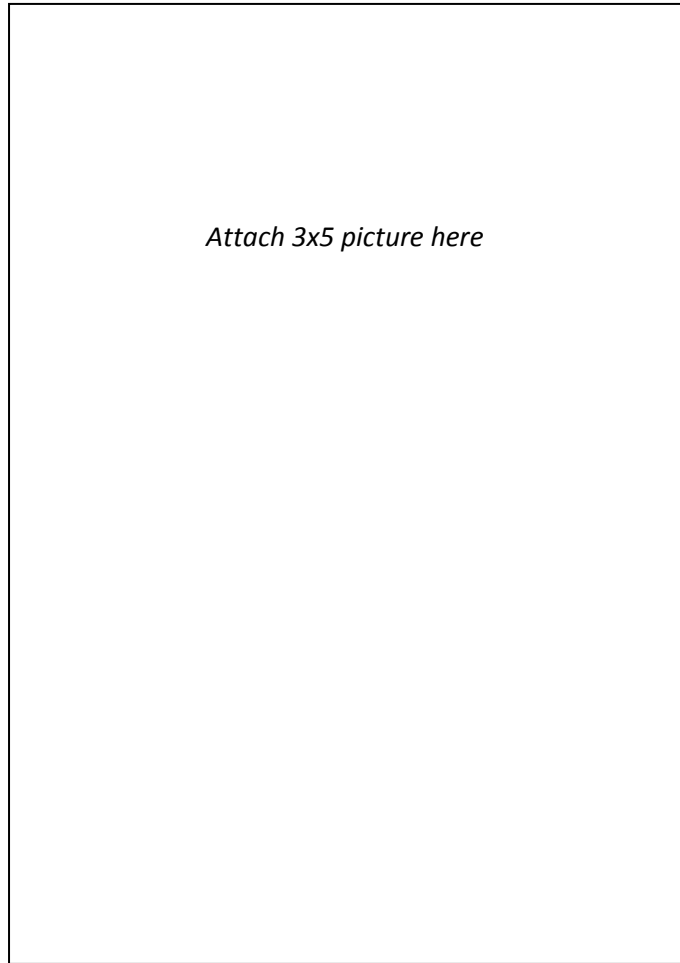
